HMAS Canberra Memorial Service

On Tuesday 9 August, Vice President Sigi Kropp attended the Memorial Service to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the loss of HMAS Canberra (I). Commander Danielle Radnidge (CO of HMAS Harman) and Sigi were called up together to lay wreaths at the memorial on the shores of Lake Burley Griffin. The RAN heavy cruiser HMAS Canberra was severely damaged off Guadalcanal (Solomon Islands) in an attack by a powerful Japanese naval force in what became known as the Battle of Savo Island. HMAS Canberra sunk on 9 August 1942 with 193 casualties including 84 killed or died of wounds.

Vietnam Veterans Day Remembrance Service

On Thursday 18 August, Secretary Judith Rowe attended the Vietnam Veterans Day Remembrance Service at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial on Anzac Parade. She followed the growing trend of laying a book ('Radio Girl' by David Dufty) rather than a wreath. The inscribed books are presented to local school libraries. 18 August was chosen as Vietnam

and New Zealand soldiers fought a pitched battle against 2,000 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong Troops in a rubber plantation near Long Tan. The Australians prevailed but lost 18 killed and 24 wounded.

Marion Stevens Chair

WRAN No 5 Marion Stevens joined the RAN Wireless/Transmitting Station Canberra as one of the first 14 women to join the Women's Royal Australian Naval Service (WRANS) in 1941. The same RAN communications station was subsequently commissioned as HMAS *Harman* on 1 July 1943.

The chair comprises a tapestry of WWII call signs, drawn from Marion's memory and sewn by hand into the fabric, which took Marion 14 months to complete. At the time of the sinking of HMAS *Sydney*, lost in November 1941 to the German raider HSK *Kormoran*, there were suggestions that operators at *Harman* may have missed *Sydney's* distress calls. Marion's tapestry serves to dispel this suggestion by recording that *Sydney* was not fitted with the equipment required for *Harman* to receive such messages. *Sydney* could only transmit in W/T (Morse) not R/T (voice).

Marion learnt her telegraphist skills with the Women's Emergency Signalling Corps, formed by Florence McKenzie. Marion's rise through the ranks was rapid and as a Chief Petty Officer she became the first female to take charge of a Navy unit, the Molonglo W/T Station. Marion's term as Officer in Charge of Molonglo ended in early 1945 when she was posted to HMAS *Cerberus* to undertake her Officer Training Course. Marion was subsequently promoted to Third Officer WRANS on 10 May 1945, returning to HMAS *Harman* where she remained until the end of the war.

With the demobilisation and disbandment of the WRANS, Marion returned to civilian life and studied music and singing at the Sydney Conservatorium. She later toured Australia and New Zealand with the Gilbert and Sullivan Company. With the reforming of the WRANS in 1951, Marion rejoined and served until September 1955.

DVA News

AWM Council Member Appointment

The Albanese Government will recommend the Governor-General appoint the Hon Kim Beazley AC as a member of the Council of the Australian War Memorial.

Minister Keogh said during Mr Beazley's term as Defence Minister, he was responsible for the establishment of the Royal Australian Navy's submarine program and he's continued to work closely with the veteran community as the Patron of RSL WA.

DVA Consultation on Legislation Reform

Consultation on reforming veterans' legislation has commenced today with the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) seeking submissions from the community.

The Australian Government recently agreed to Recommendation 1 of the Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide Interim Report, which called for the development and passage of legislation to simplify and harmonise the framework for veterans' compensation, rehabilitation and other entitlements.

Minister for Veterans' Affairs the Hon. Matt Keogh said the Government is determined to deliver on its commitment to implement this recommendation in accordance with the timeline set out by the Royal Commission.

A significant investigation of the legislative framework has already been completed by the Productivity Commission in its 2019 inquiry report A Better Way to Support Veterans. The Royal Commission identified recommendations in this report for the Government to consider as part of this reform process and we are now seeking feedback on both the recommendations made by the Productivity Commission and the Royal Commission in relation to legislative reform.

Pension Increases

The DVA Compensation payments were increased on 20th September 2022 in line with the usual CPI/MTAWE Indexation increase.

The Federal Budget of 2022-23 that was tabled in October 2022 included the election promise of a \$1,000 per annum increase to the TPI Compensation payment. The legislation should be passed sometime in November so that the increase can commence as at 1st January 2023.

Royal Commission Update

The Royal Commission into Defence and Veterans Suicide is continuing, and will recommence in Darwin on 1st August 2022 and then in Darwin on 28th November 2022. An interim report was provided by the Commissioners on the 11th August 2022 which is at <u>https://defenceveteransuicide.royalcommission.gov.au/publications/interim-report</u>. The final report is due to be tabled on 17th June 2024.
