WRANS Memorial Service 2023

The Commanding Officer of HMAS Harman, CMDR Danielle Radnidge, asked if we would consider changing the date of our Memorial Service from October to Sunday 2 July. It would be for this year only to coincide with the week of celebrations for the 80th anniversary of the commissioning of HMAS Harman. The WRANS Memorial at HMAS Harman had been officially opened in July 2003 during the celebrations of Harman's 60th anniversary. The memorial service has been held each year since, on the Saturday closest to the 20th October which was the anniversary of the formation of the WRANS Association. At the General Meeting on Saturday 11 February, the members agreed that the memorial service should be moved for this year only, from October to Sunday 2 July 2023.

The service will be held at the memorial (weather permitting) followed by light refreshments at the Bonshaw Mess. In case a bad weather, the service will be held at the Bonshaw Mess. Those attending will need to provide names in advance so that they can be allowed access to Harman. Those staying on for the refreshments will need to pay \$10 per head in advance for catering purposes. We have also been invited to join the Freedom of Entry to Queanbeyan march on Saturday 1st July. At the General Meeting the membership agreed to participate. More details will be provided in due course.

20th Anniversary of the WRANS – Naval Women's Association (ACT)

Naming of Neighbourhood Park at Campbell Shops

Last year Chris Lamb saw an article regarding the naming of the neighbourhood park behind the Campbell, ACT shops and asking for suggestions. The streets in Campbell have defence force personnel as their theme. However, women are not well represented with Provan Street being the only street commemorating a woman. Frances Betty Provan was WRAN 1. She joined as a Telegraphist and later became a Third Officer WRANS.

The committee discussed a number of options and decided to nominate Joan Streeter OBE. Joan joined the WRANS as an assistant writer in January 1943 and served for 23 years, 15 years as Director WRANS. ACT Planning thanked us for the nomination and will let us know when they have made a decision.

Naming of a Building at HMAS Harman

The Commanding Officer of HMAS Harman advised that a new Joint Information Warfare Building (JIWF) at Harman will open in July 2023 and they are planning to name the building after someone who has connections to Harman, Cyber and Communications.

The project would like to make the decision by Mid-March. Therefore, she apologised for the short turn around, and asked for any possible candidates to be submitted by 24 February. The CO would really love to see the building named after a WRAN.

After much discussion, the committee agreed to nominate Florence Violet McKenzie (Mrs Mac) and Commander Norma Uhlmann. While Mrs Mac was not a Wran, she campaigned successfully to the Navy to accept women and she accompanied the first Wrans to the Naval Wireless Transmitting Station, Canberra that was later to become HMAS Harman. CMDR Uhlmann served on many occasions at HMAS Harman as both a WRAN and an officer and was the first female linguist.

Australian War Memorial Places of Pride

A few years ago the Australian War Memorial (AWM) launched a program to record the location, accompanied by a photograph, of every publicly accessible war memorial in Australia. In 2022 the War Memorial reported that over 10,000 memorials had been identified and the data base continues to grow through the efforts of ex-service organizations, local councils and volunteers to name but a few of the contributors.

The Places of Pride library is easily accessible by the general public via the website placesofpride.awm.gov.au and it is not necessary to have an account to enter the site and search the data base through an intuitive and straightforward menu. It is possible to locate memorials within your local area or further afield during your travels. You might be surprised by the number and type of memorials in your local area and elsewhere.




Whereas in the past
War Memorials
were firstly
established mainly
by local



communities after the Boer and First World wars to allow families to grieve and pay their respects to local servicemen and women, they have over time developed to encompass a broader perspective to recognise servicemen and women engaged in conflicts and peacekeeping operations from the Boer War to Afghanistan.

Servicewomen have not been ignored. To be found in the World War II galleries of the Australian War Memorial there is a striking sculpture of two WRANs and within the western grounds there is a memorial dedicated solely to all servicewomen (see accompanying photographs). Increasingly across the country local communities and organizations are commissioning and dedicating memorials to specifically honour servicewomen from their district or service. Recently examples were seen in Swan Hill, Victoria and Adelaide. There are many more such memorials to be found in every State.

While our tendency is to pay homage at memorials on special occasions such as Anzac Day or Armistice



Day why not when next "out and about" close to home consider stopping by a local memorial to check it out, or



when traveling further afield consider researching the Places of Pride website before you go and plan a stop at one of the memorials dotted around the countryside. Who knows you might even stumble upon one that has not been registered and/or photographed and become a contributor to the Places of Pride collection. Many folk will come to appreciate your thoughtfulness.

DVA Consultation on Legislation Reform

Information received from the DVA Secretary

"The Minister for Veterans' Affairs and Defence Personnel, The Hon Matt Keogh MP, has today announced that the Government will be undertaking consultation with the veteran community and other stakeholders about a proposed pathway to simplify the veterans' legislative framework: <u>Veterans' Legislation Reform</u> Consultation Pathway takes shape | Minister for Veterans' Affairs (dva.gov.au).

As you know, the Interim Report of the Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide found that the complexity of the veterans' system is adversely affecting the mental health of veterans. The proposal being put forward for consultation by the Government is for a future model where all claims would be considered under the existing *Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2004*, rather than the three legislative schemes as is currently the case. This proposal would effectively implement many of the reforms recommended by the Productivity Commission in its 2019 report *A Better Way to Support Veterans*, with simpler outcomes.

The Minister and the Department will be undertaking direct consultation with key ex-service organisations around the country. While details of these consultations are still being finalised, there will be an opportunity for you and your members to participate in these processes.

The Department will also be consulting ex-service organisations through the National Consultative Framework and other key forums. In addition, consultation with veterans and their families, ADF members and other key stakeholders will be undertaken through webinars.

Written submissions from any interested parties, have also been invited, by **12 May 2023**. These can be made through the consultation webpage at https://www.dva.gov.au/legislationconsultation2023 or by emailing legislation.reform@dva.gov.au. Faxed and posted submissions will also be accepted – see the website page for relevant details.

I encourage you to put forward the views of your organisation about the proposal, and you are also welcome to provide your personal views through one of the channels above.

We will continue to update you how consultation is proceeding at our future meetings.

From the ATO for those affected by the *Douglas Case* decision

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is sending letters to some veterans who are affected by the *Douglas* Full Federal Court decision for the 2010-11 to 2019-20 income years. This covers invalidity pensions paid to veterans under the MSBS (Military Super Benefit Scheme) or DFRDBS (Defence Force Retirement and Death Benefits Scheme) that commenced on or after 20 September 2007.

The ATO says that over 2,500 veterans have asked to have their prior year assessments amended since this Court decision. Most of these veterans have received tax refunds.

The ATO is sending letters to veterans who have not yet requested a review for prior years. If you have not yet had your amendments done, your letter will be issued in the coming months. The ATO urges veterans to be patient as there are many people to contact.

The letters will include a brief form to complete and a reply-paid envelope. Veterans should consider their personal circumstances and if they want to participate in the ATO's review process.

If you use a tax agent, the ATO will let them know they are sending you a letter. This will make it easier if you need to call your agent about the letter.

The ATO says it is committed to finalising reviews as quickly as possible, but each person's circumstances are different. It may take a while to determine any refund owing to you, but they will keep you informed along the way.
