Violet McKenzie Park, Campbell

On 06 September 2023 the neighbourhood park in Campbell, behind the Campbell shops was officially named Violet McKenzie Park. The unveiling of the name board with details of Mrs Mac was conducted by the ACT Government Minister Mick Gentlemen. The ceremony was attended by serving Naval personnel, Ex-Wrans, Australian War Memorial personnel, other ACT Government personnel and locals. Details of what is written on the board are as follows:

'Violet McKenzie Park

Florence Violet McKenzie OBE (1890 - 1982) Electrical Engineer, signals trainer, women's advocate.

Florence Violet McKenzie nee Wallace, known affectionately as 'Mrs Mac' played a prominent role to help establish the Women's Royal Australian Naval Service (WRANS) during the Second World War. A pioneer in Australian radio and electrical engineering, she was committed to technical education and training especially for women.

With war looming, McKenzie established the Womens Emergency Signalling Corps in 1939 offering free training in morse code, visual signalling and international code. She campaigned tirelessly for the Royal Australian Air Force and the Royal Australian Navy to accept her skilled female telegraphists as defence personnel.

In 1941 she proudly accompanied 14 trainees to the HMAS Harman communications station in Canberra where they began service as the first Wrans. Florence Violet McKenzie was appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire in 1950 for voluntary service to the Womens Emergency Signalling Corps.'

ACT Street Names.

Two streets in the ACT are named after WRANS. McClemans Street in Watson is named after Sheila McClemans and Provan Street in Campbell is named after Francis Provan. The suburbs of Canberra have themes for their street names. Watson's theme is judges and members of the legal profession and Campbell's theme is defence personnel.



Sheila Mary McClemans, CMG, OBE (3 May 1909 – 10 June 1988) was a lawyer who graduated from the University of Western Australia in 1930. She joined the WRANS in 1943 and rose to the rank of Chief Officer (Commander) and was Director WRANS from 1944 to 1947.

Francis Provan (17 November 1911 – 21 June 1963) was WRAN No 1, one of fourteen telegraphists from the Womens Emergency Signalling Corps who arrived in Canberra 28 April 1941 to begin working for the Navy in what was to become the WRANS.

After being promoted to Leading Telegraphist and then Petty Officer, she completed the WRANS Officers course and was promoted to Third Officer in February 1943. In October 1946 she was demobilized from the Navy.



First Women Politicians



On International Women's Day 2023, new statues were unveiled in front of the Museum of Australian Democracy (Old Parliament House) in Canberra to recognize the first two women in parliament. On the left is Dame Dorothy Tagney (1907 – 1985), the first woman elected to the Senate and the first female member of the Australian Labor Party to be elected to the Federal Parliament.

She served from 1943 to 1968 and supported the establishment of the Australian National University (ANU), becoming a founding member of the ANU Council in 1951.

On the right is Dame Enid Lyons (1897 - 1981), the first woman to be elected to the House of Representatives in Federal Parliament and the first female member to be

appointed to the Federal Cabinet (Liberal Party). She served from 1943 to 1951 and was then the Commissioner of the Australian Broadcasting Commission (ABC) from 1951 to 1962. She wrote regular columns for the Women's Weekly and the Melbourne Sun and authored three books.



DVA News

Royal Commission Update – 7 December 2023

The Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide has been granted a three-month extension by

the Federal Government to complete its inquiries.

The Royal Commission's final report must now be delivered by Monday 9 September 2024.

Launch of Defence Family and Domestic Violence Prevention and Response Strategy

This strategy was released on 30 November 2023 and is underpinned by the four domains of Prevention, Early Intervention, Response and Recovery and healing, as outlined in the *National Plan to End Violence against Women and Children 2022–2032*.

DVA has also launched DVA Family and Domestic Violence Strategy 2020–25 and this work will complement the National Plan to End Violence against Women and Children along with our Action Plans

Anzac Day 2024

Registrations open for 2024 Anzac Day Services overseas. Australians are now invited to register their attendance at the 2024 Anzac Day Dawn Services in France and Türkiye to commemorate our Anzacs, and all those who have served our nation in conflict and peacekeeping operations in the years since.

The Gallipoli Anzac Day Dawn Service will take place at the Anzac Commemorative Site on the Gallipoli peninsula. This will be followed by the Australian Memorial service at Lone Pine, the site of one of the fiercest battles that the Australians fought during the First World War.

The Dawn Service in France will be hosted at the Australian National Memorial near Villers-Bretonneux, followed by a service at the Digger Memorial, just outside the town of Bullecourt.

Those planning to attend these overseas Dawn Services can now register for their free attendance passes online at https://commemorations.teg.com.au/en/. Registration is essential.

Hearing Aids

Many Ex-Service Organisations have advocated for many years to have the provision of suitable hearing aids for Veterans to be made available. To this end success has been achieved in a small way with approvals now able to be obtained if the hearing aids are required for employment or if the Veteran has dexterity issues that require a hearing aid with Bluetooth facilities.

The DVA Secretary will be trying to obtain funding for additional hearing aids needs to be met with the next budget determining the success, or otherwise, of this endeavour.

Veterans and War Widows are asked to provide the form number D9398 which is a new form for the Audiologists to complete to obtain prior approval for the required hearing aid.

DVA is managing the processes the Department utilises in the prior approval process for hearing aid to identify the barriers and break-points of this process.

If you have any difficulty in gaining approval for the required hearing aid, can you please advise me so that the processes can be identified.
