#### **ANZAC Day 2024**

For the last two years, our Association has marched in Queanbeyan on Anzac Day due to the renovation work being done at the Australian War Memorial (AWM). We have been assured that the parade ground at the AWM will be completed by Anzac Day so the committee has decided that we should march there this year. The march in Queanbeyan is quite small and consists of a group of uniform Navy personnel from HMAS Harman followed by a group of veterans all marching together in the one group. The march is due to commence at 0930 but more details will be provided closer to the event.

#### TS Canberra End of Year Parade

Pauline Gribble represented our Association at the Naval Cadets TS Canberra End of Year Parade on Friday 8 December 2023 at HMAS Harman. She presented our annual award to the Female Cadet of the Year, CDTAB Georgia Ween. Our Association has been presenting this award each year since 1987. The successful Cadet is presented with a certificate and a book from our Association.

### **Navy Chapel at HMAS Harman**

The HMAS Harman Chaplain, CHAP Sonja Nugent invited the ex-WRANS to attend a short service at Saint Gabriel's Chapel at HMAS Harman on Thursday 15 February 2024 to mark the 48<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the dedication of the Chapel on that day in 1976. #### **Dedication of new memorial at the Australian War Memorial**



On the morning of Thursday 22 February 2024, a small number of our members attended the dedication ceremony for the new memorial titled "For Every Drop Shed in Anguish" and built by Alex Seton in the grounds of the Australian War Memorial (AWM). The intent for this sculpture is to provide a place at the AWM for those who have experienced and witnessed the ongoing trauma that can result from service, and for AWM visitors to reflect on service experiences and to remember the long-term cost of war and service. It recognises those who have suffered as a result of their service. veterans suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and physical wounds or

injuries, acknowledging that at the extreme end, it can result in death by suicide.

The sculpture is a field of marble droplets representing every drop of blood, sweat and tears ever shed by Australian military personnel and their families. Carved from Queensland Pearl Marble, the warm tones and intricate veins of the forms invite contemplation and reflection on their delicate shapes welcoming every visitor to touch their surface.

Those attending the dedication ceremony were invited to afternoon tea in the grounds of Government House in the afternoon.

#### Australian Servicewomen's Memorial

After visiting the new memorial, you should consider visiting the nearby Servicewomen's Memorial. It was unveiled on 27 March 1999 and is dedicated to all women who served. A riverbed of black granite bisects the mosaic top with one side representing the pre 1945 era and the other side, post 1945. Although it has been in the grounds of the Australian War Memorial for nearly 25 years it is not very well known.

Department of Health and Aged Care has developed an online survey to gather client feedback, and have sent DVA a flyer with a QR code and information for veterans to participate. The Government has today the commencement of public consultation on proposed changes to simplify veterans' entitlements, compensation and rehabilitation legislation.

The Government is seeking comments on the draft Veterans' Entitlements, Treatment and Support (Simplification and Harmonisation) Bill 2024 that, if passed by Parliament, will reform more than a century of veteran compensation legislation.
